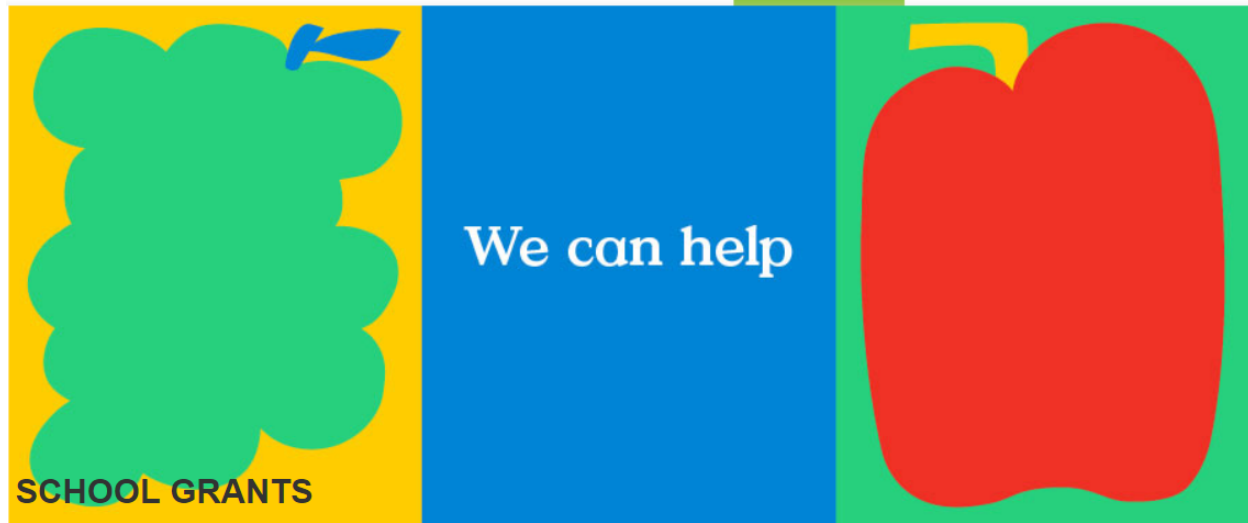
Grad 2021 Update

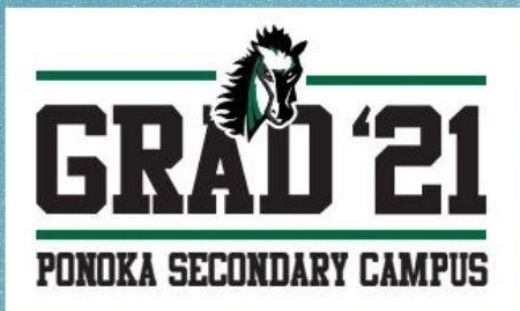
