Policies and Procedures for Next Year

Just want to give everyone some knowledge moving into next year. Many of our school specific policies and procedures can be found in our student handbook. Linked <u>HERE</u>

I wanted to specifically outline our attendance and flex policies for next year. Attendance at school is extremely important and if students miss too much they are not successful. We want to ensure students have the best possible chance to be successful in their studies. The school WILL NOT be running online flexible classes next year, attendance at school will be mandatory.

HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE POLICY

High School Attendance - NEW POLICY - (September 2021)
Student attendance will be monitored regularly by our teachers / administrators and in the event that:

- a) a high school student misses a class; the teacher will work with the student to schedule a tutorial time to catch up. The student will be assigned to a tutorial block / time outside of the scheduled class to catch up on the learning opportunities missed while away.
- b) a student reaches 3 absences total in any one class; teachers will be contacting parents/guardians to have a conversation reiterating the need to attend. The student will also be assigned to a tutorial time to continue to catch up on the missed classes.
- c) a student reaches 6 absences total in any one class; the teacher will forward the student's name to administration, and a parent/guardian meeting will be scheduled with an administrator to confirm importance and validate the necessity of student's attendance in class to be successful in the course. A plan will be developed between student/parent/administrator to improve attendance.
- d) a student reaches 10 absences total in any one class; the student will be withdrawn from the traditional "in class" course. An alternative placement will be evaluated and designed for the student moving forward as they will have missed too many classes to be successful in the traditional stream.

FLEX Time

This school year, we will be offering in our timetable for Grades 10, 11 and 12 students, built in flex time Monday - Thursday. This is scheduled time and is <u>MANDATORY</u> when assigned by a teacher. Attendance will be taken when assigned and consequences given if missed.

The purpose of FLEX is to have time and support to master concepts through practice and refinement on specific topics:

- is offered 40 minutes a day 4 times per week (Monday to Thursday); TA on Friday's
- · students may use FLEX as often as they need
- teachers have the right and responsibility to assign students to FLEX based on attendance, grades and level of understanding of course outcome.
- · A time to run specialty sessions with students:
 - post-secondary research
 - guest speakers
 - scholarship work sessions
 - career planning
- time to work with students in smaller groups who need extra time to master a concept
- did poorly on a test, get those 10-15 students together for a concentrated period of time to relearn a concept they didn't learn
- · extra time for things that did not get accomplished (ie. in class homework)
- to provide "just time" that some students do not have in the scheme of work/sports/school/family commitments, etc.
- is subject specific or teacher specific, so students may be working with any qualified staff who will offer what they need
