### **Attendance - NEW POLICY**

## **High School Attendance - NEW POLICY – Semester 2**

Student attendance will be monitored regularly by our administrators, and in the event:

- a. that a student reaches **5 absences total in any one class**, teachers will be contacting parents/guardians to have a conversation reiterating the need to attend.
- b. that a student reaches **10 absences total in any one class**, a parent/guardian meeting will be scheduled with an administrator to confirm importance and validate the necessity of student's attendance in class to be successful in the course. A plan will be developed between student/parent/administrator to improve attendance.
- c. that a student reaches **15 absences total in any one class**, a second Parent/Guardian meeting will be required with an administrator with the intention to re-evaluate the plan and outline additional supports to be put into place.
- d. that student reaches **20 absences total in any one class**, the student will be withdrawn from the traditional "in class" course. The student will then be enrolled in our Enhanced Learning Program to give students the opportunity to earn credits.

Self- Regulation:  
The Rollercoaster Of Our Emotions

Children are emotionally driven. As they grow children learn how to manage their emotions and the actions/ behaviours that follow the those feelings. Some children struggle to learn this skill. This presentation will provide some information on what is happening for your child, as well as how to support your child in managing their emotional rollercoaster. Some concerns that can fall under the emotional regulation issues include ADHD/ ADD, children struggling with outbursts, anxiety, anger and impact of trauma.
