It is your job to make sure you provide the necessary evidence to meet the eligibility requirements of the awards you are applying for. If you don't meet the criteria, you should not apply for it.

A resume of your accomplishments must be created. This is a significant part of this application package.

If you don't tell the sponsor about your accomplishments, they won't know.
You should focus on your:

- academic achievements
- school athletics
- involvement in the arts (drama, music, art) at school
- your involvement in leadership (in & out of school)
- detailed description of the volunteer work you have done
- involvement in any community activities; past or present (dance, 4H, hockey, swimming, golf, music etc.

As a final piece to your application package you should provide any further information that you feel is relevant in considering you for these awards. Again, please be very specific and provide as much detail as possible.

Awards That Require Resume Submissions

1. ALMITA SCHOLARSHIP

Presented to a graduating student pursuing post-secondary education in an apprenticeship trade program of their choice. Preference will be given to students entering the welding and heavy equipment technician programs. Selection based on academics, school and community involvement. The recipient for this award will be decided by the PSC Staff.

Award: \$500.00 Award and Certificate

2. BGC WOLF CREEK/ PONOKA YOUTH CENTRE

Presented to a graduating student who has applied for post-secondary institution and participated as a Teen Mentor for a minimum of one year or as a mentee for a minimum of two years. The recipient of this award is decided by the Boys and Girls Club located at the Ponoka Youth Centre.

Award: \$500.00 Award and Certificate

3. BIRCHLAND DENTAL CLINIC SCHOLARSHIP

Presented to a graduating student continuing in either a non-degree dental related field at a post-secondary institution or pre-dental sciences. Proof of acceptance to a post-secondary institution is required. The recipient for this award will be decided by the PSC Staff.
